

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CERTIFICATES IN ENGINEERING SUBJECTS <sup>1</sup>

*(See also General Regulations)*

From time to time courses in engineering subjects leading to the award of Certificates in Engineering Subjects as determined by the Senate may be held by the Engineering Departments in conjunction with the School of Professional and Continuing Education.

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**E 21** To be eligible for the award of a certificate in an engineering subject, a candidate shall

- (a) comply with the General Regulations;
- (b) possess the qualifications required for admission to the certificate as determined by the Senate from time to time; and
- (c) complete the prescribed curriculum and satisfy the examiners in accordance with the regulations that the Senate may institute from time to time with regard to the award of the certificate.

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**E 22** The curriculum for a certificate in an engineering subject shall extend over one academic year and include a Final Examination normally held at the same time as the BEng Examination.

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**E 23** To complete the curriculum, a candidate shall

- (a) follow instruction on the syllabuses prescribed and complete satisfactorily all written and practical assignments where prescribed; and
- (b) satisfy the examiners in each of the examination papers prescribed.

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**E 24** A candidate who has failed to satisfy the examiners at the Final Examination shall be required either to repeat the curriculum and to present himself for re-examination when the examination is next held or to present himself for re-examination when the examination is next held without repeating the curriculum but shall not be eligible for a mark of distinction unless the Senate directs that he shall be so eligible because of exceptional circumstances. A candidate who has failed to satisfy the examiners at a second attempt of the Final Examination shall be recommended for discontinuation of studies under the provisions of General Regulation G 12. If such a candidate is not required by the Senate to discontinue his studies and is permitted to present himself for examination for a third time, he shall then in no circumstances be eligible for a mark of distinction.

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**E 25** The names of successful candidates shall be published alphabetically, with a mark showing distinction gained over the whole examination. Any mark of distinction shall be recorded in the candidate's certificate.
