# REGULATIONS FOR THE ADVANCED DIPLOMA IN ORTHODONTICS (AdvDipOrth)

These regulations apply to candidates admitted in 2023-2024 and thereafter.

(See also General Regulations and Regulations for Taught Postgraduate Curricula)

The Advanced Diploma in Orthodontics is a postgraduate award following the satisfactory completion of a prescribed course of advanced study and paper related to orthodontics.

## **Admission requirements**

**D67** To be eligible for admission to the curriculum for the Advanced Diploma in Orthodontics, a candidate shall

- (a) comply with the General Regulations and the Regulations for Taught Postgraduate Curricula;
- (b) hold the degree of Master of Dental Surgery in Orthodontics and Dentofacial Orthopaedics of this University, or a degree or other qualification of equivalent standard from another university or comparable institution accepted for this purpose;
- (c) for a candidate who is seeking admission on the basis of a qualification from a university or comparable institution outside Hong Kong of which the language of teaching and/or examination is not English, shall satisfy the University English language requirement applicable to higher degrees as prescribed under General Regulation G2(b); and
- (d) satisfy the examiners in a qualifying examination if deemed necessary.

# **Qualifying examination**

- **D68** (a) A qualifying examination may be set to test a candidate's formal academic ability or his/her ability to complete the prescribed courses of study and clinical practice. It shall consist of one or more written papers, a practical examination and oral examinations.
  - (b) A candidate who is required to satisfy the examiners in a qualifying examination shall not be permitted to register until he/she has satisfied the examiners in the examination.

# Award of diploma

**D69** To be eligible for the award of the Advanced Diploma in Orthodontics, a candidate shall

- (a) comply with the General Regulations and the Regulations for Taught Postgraduate Curricula; and
- (b) complete the curriculum and satisfy the examiners in accordance with the regulations set out below.

## **Period of study**

**D70** The curriculum shall normally extend over a period of twelve months of full-time study or twenty-four months of part-time study. Candidates shall not be permitted to extend their studies beyond the maximum period of registration of twenty-four months of full-time study or thirty-six months of part-time study, unless otherwise permitted or required by the Board of the Faculty.

## **Completion of curriculum**

- **D71** To complete the curriculum, a candidate shall
  - (a) follow instruction in the courses prescribed and complete satisfactorily all coursework requirements;
  - (b) achieve the minimum of 90 credits:
  - (c) satisfy the examiners in all examinations as may be required; and
  - (d) complete and submit a research paper and/or literature review or clinical paper which satisfy the examiners.

## Research or clinical paper

**D72** The research and/or literature review or clinical paper shall be prepared for/submitted for publication in a dental journal in the final academic year of study; the candidate shall submit a statement that the paper represents his/her own work (mainly). The examiners may prescribe an oral examination on the subject of the paper.

#### Assessments

**D73** Assessments take the form of a written paper, oral, practical and clinical examinations.

**D74** A candidate who has failed to satisfy the examiners in any part of the assessments may be permitted to present himself/herself again for assessment at a time to be determined by the Board of Examiners; or he/she may be recommended for discontinuation of studies under the provisions of General Regulation G12.

**D75** A candidate who has presented a paper which has failed to satisfy the examiners may be permitted to revise and re-present the paper within a period to be determined by the Board of Examiners; or he may be recommended for discontinuation of studies under the provisions of General Regulation G12.

**D76** In accordance with TPG 5(c), a candidate who has exceeded the maximum period of registration specified in Regulation D50 shall be recommended for discontinuation of studies.

# **Grading System**

**D77** Individual courses shall be graded as "Pass" or "Fail".

# SYLLABUSES FOR THE ADVANCED DIPLOMA IN ORTHODONTICS

#### A. PREAMBLE

- 1. The objectives of the Advanced Diploma in Orthodontics are to enable candidates to achieve an advanced level of knowledge and competence in a branch of orthodontics by means of
  - (a) a prescribed course of study having a minimum of 1800 hours of coursework (i.e., lectures and seminars and related written and practical work); and
  - (b) additionally, a supervised research clinical project and the submission of a research paper and /or literature review or clinical paper.

The prescribed course of study will include subjects to be taken by all candidates, in accordance with the syllabus specified by the Programme Director.

- 2. Candidates must attend for clinical practice for at least three sessions a week in such programme area or areas as are prescribed.
- 3. The methods and pattern of assessment and examination of each candidate will be determined by the Programme Director.

# **B. SYLLABUSES**

This curriculum extends over a period of twenty-four months of part time advanced study and supervised clinical practice relating to diagnosis and treatment of complex dentofacial anomalies by orthodontic means in a multi-disciplinary setting.

#### **Curriculum structure**

The curriculum includes the following courses/components:

# **DENT7652 Clinical orthodontics (45 credits)**

Treatment of advanced orthodontic cases such as multi-disciplinary treatment, lingual orthodontics, etc.

Assessment: 50% portfolio and 50% presentation

# **DENT7653 Research in orthodontics (30 credits)**

Original research/review/audit in orthodontics

Assessment: research manuscript

# **DENT7651** Capstone Experience: Portfolio of clinical work (6 credits)

Log book of 6 advanced orthodontics cases

Assessment: clinical portfolio
